Desire of protectionism remains high in Africa. Findings from a recent <u>survey</u> conducted by Afr obarometer

(a pan-African survey research network that conducts evaluations of democracy, governance, and quality of life in the continent),

show considerable resistance among South Africans to free movement and trade

Precisely, 51% of respondents is in favor of protecting domestic producers from foreign competitors against a 45% supporting free cross-border movement

Interestingly, opposition to free cross-border movement grows in cities (54%) more than in rural areas (44%) and increases with respondents' education level, reaching 56% among those with post-secondary qualifications. The survey also reveals that 44% of South African citizens consider crossing international borders in Southern Africa

as difficult or very difficult

Only 35% say it is easy

while a remaining 20% have not responded






Figure 1: Views on cross-border movement | South Africa | 2021
